Cultivated as an intercrop in coconut, clove and arecanut plantations in the constituency in three varieties, namely IISR, Viswasree and Nithyasree, nutmeg is popular for its medicinal properties and as a culinary ingredient.





Anti-oxidant-rich, aromatic cloves are organically grown spices in the Western Ghats, especially in parts of Wayanad by mostly small-scale farmers. The high medicinal value of clove oil and the culinary flavouring properties of clove seeds result in the growing demand for the spice.





WILD HONEY

Wayanad constituency is home to three varieties of wild honey, namely cheru then, van then and poottu then. Tribal people in Mananthavadi, Kalpetta, Sulthan Bathery, Pulppally, Poothadi and Nilambur collect honey from the forests over several days, and repeat the process once and sometimes, twice every year.
